OLAH Fundraiser Begins September 25, 2006

Oregon Lawyers Against Hunger (OLAH) will launch its tenth annual two-week long fundraiser to benefit the Oregon Food Bank (OFB) on September 25, ending October 6. Each dollar contributed allows Oregon Food Bank to collect and distribute more than six pounds of food worth over seven dollars and fund programs that address the root causes of hunger. Oregon remains among the top states in the nation with a hunger problem. Between July 1, 2004 and June 30,

2005, Oregon Food Bank distributed emergency food boxes to an estimated 876,000 hungry people in Oregon and Clark County, Washington. Distribution of emergency food boxes increased 4 percent over the previous year. In addition, 170 soup kitchens and shelters provided 4-million emergency meals and 362 other agencies helped more than 128,000 people. About 38 percent of those receiving emergency food are children. Oregon Food Bank is a nonprofit, charitable organization. It is the hub of a statewide

network of more than 870 hunger-relief agencies serving Oregon and Clark County. Oregon Food Bank also works to eliminate the root causes of hunger through advocacy and public education.
