

#### SUBMISSIONS TO THE BAR NEWS

We have received several requests for information or clarification in the past several weeks regarding criteria for submissions to the Bar News. We are taking the time now to answer a few of them in this format. Please let us know if your question is not among those listed below and we will try an provide an answer in an upcoming newsletter.



Do you write the articles? No, we do not write the articles. Each article must be submitted in as complete a form as possible.

Is there a maximum number of words that a submission cannot excede? No, now that we are exclusively an online publication, there is no real limit to the number of words an article can contain. However, the Editor does reserve the right to edit the content of any article.

What format should I use? There is no real "format" since each submission is created by the individual submitter. However, there are a few guidelines:

- 1. Please submit your article to the newsletter either included in the body of an email or as a Word document attachment unless the document is complete in its entirety, such as with a flyer, it can be very difficult to format a PDF.
- 2. Please have your submission as complete as possible and remember to include the basics: Who, What, When and Where.
- 3. Also include any deadlines or links for registration.
- 4. Please do not use multiple fonts, colors or "bullets" in your submission as it takes extra time in the formatting process to take care of these anomalies.
- 5. If you are submitting an announcement and would like to include a photo, please submit the photo as a JPG file. After exhaustive experimentation, this type of file seems to be the easiest to shrink down to size for placement in the newsletter without suffering distortion.
- 6. If your submission is for Office Space, Services Offered or Positions Available and it does not already have an end date, please think about how long you want the piece to run and let us know.

Is there a deadline for submissions? The deadline for submissions is the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month, or the first week day thereafter if the 20<sup>th</sup> falls on a weekend. We have selected the permanent deadline of the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month so it is easy to remember. The preparation of the newsletter is something that is done in addition to the demanding schedule of a busy law office, so please get your submissions to us within that timeframe.

We hope this has been helpful in answering some of your questions. Thank you for helping to make the Lane County Bar newsletter an interesting, educational and informative publication.


