ANDREW CLEMENT PRO BONO AWARD: To honor an individual who has provided exceptional service to persons of limited means;

**DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD**: To honor an individual who has provided extraordinary service to the legal profession and the people of Lane County;

**JOSEPH M. KOSYDAR AWARD FOR PROFESSIONALISM**: Established in memory of **Joseph Kosydar**, a long-time Lane County Deputy District Attorney who passed away in 1997. The idea came for the award from the judges who valued Joe's professionalism and civility and who wanted to periodically recognize attorneys in the Bar who exemplify those qualities. It was not the intent of the judges, however, to limit the award to trial lawyers.

This month the LCBA lunch is at The Gordon on Thursday, March 14 at noon. Doug Querin, Senior Attorney Counselor, Oregon Attorney Assistance Program will present on "Lawyer Well-Being." LCBA will seek mental health CLE credit for the one-hour presentation. Those attending will learn about: (1) The fundamentals of Well-Being; (2) Recent research regarding mental health and substance use challenges in the legal profession; (3) Common obstacles to treatment & the need for greater support of lawyer well-being; (4) Common signs and symptoms of anxiety, depression, unhealthy stress, and problematic use of substances; (5) Tools & suggestions for developing Healthy Habits and improving Well-Being; and (6) Oregon Attorney Assistance Program resources.

Finally, consider volunteering for the <u>HIV Alliance</u>. HIV Alliance was founded in Eugene, Oregon in 1994 to support people living with HIV/AIDS and prevent new HIV infections.

#### Spring Clothing Drive and CLE Thursday, April 18

Please mark your calendars for the Lane County Women Lawyers' Spring Clothing Drive and CLE on Thursday, April 18, 2024, starting at 4pm at the Old Spaghetti Factory in Eugene.

In 1999, the Oregon Bar implemented the requirement that attorneys receive training on the mandatory child abuse reporting law. That year, LCWL hosted a child abuse reporting CLE along with its first annual clothing drive at the Oregon Electric Station. Now, 25 years later, LCWL is bringing back the event—and at the same location, which was recently reopened as the **Old Spaghetti Factory.** We've come a long way, baby.

Experts from the Oregon DOJ will present on mandatory child abuse and elder abuse/vulnerable adult abuse reporting, satisfying OSB's requirements for this credit at 4-5pm. The training will be followed by a happy hour and clothing drive for all to attend, sponsored by the **Larwick Law Firm**, from 5-6:30pm.


